

SELF-GUIDED TOUR

Welcome to the birthplace of public higher education in America. Spanning 760 acres in Athens, the University of Georgia's campus has everything from historic landmarks to state-of-the-art buildings. This main campus tour starts on Broad Street at the Arch, bordering downtown Athens.

1 THE ARCH

Installed in 1857, the cast iron Arch bordering downtown Athens marks the entrance to campus and is the most iconic symbol of the University.



2 HOLMES-HUNTER ACADEMIC BUILDING

The newly-renovated Holmes-Hunter Academic Building honors UGA's first African-American students, Hamilton Holmes and Charlayne Hunter-Gault.



3 TERRELL HALL

houses the Office of Undergraduate Admissions and the Graduate School.

4 THE CHAPEL AND CHAPEL BELL

The Chapel is a former church that now hosts lectures, campus meetings, and even weddings. The Chapel Bell, located behind the Chapel, is rung to mark special occasions.




5 MOORE HALL

houses the Jere W. Morehead Honors College.

6 HERTY FIELD

Herty Field was UGA's first athletic field and was the site of our first intercollegiate football game, when UGA defeated Mercer in 1892 with a score of 50-0.



7 OLD COLLEGE

is the oldest building on campus, built in 1806. Because there was uncertainty about which way the campus would grow, the front and back of the building are identical.

8 MAIN LIBRARY

The Main Library opened in 1953, and a seven-story annex was added in 1974. Today patrons search more than 400 electronic databases 11 million times a year and download 4.5 million articles.



9 SPECIAL COLLECTIONS LIBRARIES


house materials related to the history and culture of Georgia as well as the Peabody Award archives, the most prestigious award for electronic media.

10 FINE ARTS BUILDING

houses a 682-seat theater that hosts performances open to the public.

11 MILLER LEARNING CENTER

The Miller Learning Center, opened in 2003, houses classrooms and library space in the heart of campus. It also features nearly 100 individual study rooms, a local coffee shop, and the new Creative Engagement Wing, established in 2025.



12 UGA BOOKSTORE

is the best stop to get your UGA apparel.

13 RESIDENCE HALLS

More than half of the UGA first-year class lives in one of the four high-rise RESIDENCE HALLS on Baxter Street.

14 TATE STUDENT CENTER

Named for William Tate, UGA's legendary Dean of Men from 1946 to 1971, the center contains a food court, a 500-seat movie theater, dance studios, the university's student-run radio station, and much more.



15 SANFORD STADIUM

Sanford Stadium is home to the University of Georgia Bulldogs football team. Located in the heart of campus, Sanford Stadium is one of the largest college football stadiums in the country with a capacity of 93,033.



16 SCIENCE AND AG HILL

With facilities dedicated to chemistry, physics, biology, and agriculture, students expand their knowledge on SCIENCE AND AG HILL.

17 MYERS HALL

Home to UGA's Honors Magnet Program, MYERS HALL is a residence hall that provides traditional style rooms along with a limited number of suites.

18 GEORGIA CENTER


The GEORGIA CENTER provides a hotel, conference center, dining facilities, and event space to the UGA community and visitors alike.

19 SCIENCE LEARNING CENTER

The SCIENCE LEARNING CENTER contains over 122,000 square feet of modern space for STEM instruction. It features labs, classrooms, collaboration space, and even a coffee and bagel shop.

20 STEGEMAN COLISEUM

Stegeman Coliseum opened in 1964 and is home to UGA men's and women's basketball, gymnastics, and volleyball, with a capacity of more than 10,000.



21 BUTTS-MEHRE HERITAGE HALL

houses the UGA Athletic Association. The building has a museum of athletic memorabilia open to the public during the week.

22 HUGH HODGSON CONCERT HALL

hosts the University of Georgia's large ensemble performances, world-class artists, and major international orchestras.

23 GEORGIA MUSEUM OF ART

The Georgia Museum of Art is both an academic museum and the official state museum of art, located on UGA's campus. Admission is free, but the museum is closed on Mondays.



24 RAMSEY CENTER

provides 440,000 square feet of student athletic and recreation space, employing nearly 600 student staff and welcoming more than 6,000 people each day. A hub of student activity, Ramsey is home to Bauerle Pool at Gabrielsen Natatorium, where the UGA Swimming & Diving teams host meets.

25 VISITORS CENTER

welcomes thousands of visitors to campus, offers campus tours and provides information about UGA academic offerings. (405 College Station Rd, Athens, GA 30602) (706) 542-0842 | visit.uga.edu
